

SEX FAIL BETTER THAN HAIR LOSS

BRITISH men worry more about going bald than being impotent, a survey reveals.

Ending up with a cue ball bonce is the most feared aspect of ageing for 94 per cent of fellas.

But only 89 per cent are scared of failing to perform in bed.

Three-quarters are concerned about going grey and 64 per cent about middle-aged spread.

Next on the list is losing teeth (61 per cent), needing "jam jar" glasses (45 per cent), going deaf (31 per cent) and having bad breath (24 per cent).

zie said of the top fear revealed by the survey of 2,000 men: "Hair loss can be genuinely distressing for men.

"It can't be easily disguised and people do seem to think it's fair game for jokes, unlike things like putting on weight or going grey."

Toni, of Altrincham, Gtr Manchester, added: "Men who lose hair are expected to adopt a laissez-faire attitude and take insults with good humour.

"The pressure this causes can have a huge effect on men's self-confidence, which has knock-on effects on physical and mental well-being."
